Class 5 – 3 vases of Daffodils 3 stems per vase - any variety

- Prizes will be presented at approximately 3.15 pm
(Exhibits may NOT be removed before the Presentation of Trophies)
- All exhibits must be grown or made by the exhibitor except in the Floral Art Section
- Exhibitors may stage ANY NUMBER of exhibits in each class
- Entry is open to members and non-members @ 25p per entry
- Junior classes, 45 – 50 (age up to 11 years) are free to enter.*
- 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, Highly Commended and Commended cards will be awarded. There are no money prizes.

The judge's decision is final, no appeals permitted. Although every care will be taken, the Hallow Horticultural Society will not be responsible for loss of or to damage to exhibits and /or accessories.
